### History

Comprising the center portion of the original territory of Assumption before the creation of new parishes in the east and southwest, Fulton Ferry Landing ran from Doughty and Vine Streets to Main Street extending from the river to where the Brooklyn Queens Expressway is now. While this area had been the Brooklyn terminus of ferry transport across the East River since as far back as 1642, the landmass originally only extended to about where Fulton and Front Streets intersect today. The land between Fulton and Water Streets to the river was created by landfill in the late eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. In 1704 a road was laid out to the ferry landing and quickly became Brooklyn's main thoroughfare. When steam began powering these ferries in 1814 thanks to Robert Fulton's invention, the route was rechristened from "Ferry Road" to "Fulton Street" and the already bustling commercial district near the docks expanded in activity almost exponentially. For example, on September 13, 1834 (which happened also to be the year Brooklyn was incorporated as a city), the following record of ferry transport was recorded: "64 pleasure wagons, 22 coaches, 43 pigs, 22 saddle horses, 49 milk carts, 52 loaded wagons, 27 empty wagons...and 7,988 foot passengers."

Because of all this commerce and transport of people and goods, all sorts of businesses soon sprouted up in the neighborhood around the docks. By the time of Assumption's founding in 1842, the new parish had all sorts of establishments and their patrons falling under its pastoral care including taverns, oyster saloons, rooming and bath houses, and by the 1850's offices for banks, insurance companies and law firms. Thus, in the years leading to the Civil War, Fulton Ferry Landing had become Brooklyn's equivalent to Manhattan's Wall Street, and because Brooklyn history in this neighborhood runs deep. For example, it was here in 1841 in a building on Fulton Street which exists today where the *Brooklyn Daily Eagle* was founded as well as where later the charter for the company that built the Brooklyn Bridge was drawn up. While the area was not residential apart from the mostly transient population in the many rooming houses, Assumption catered to their needs as well as the many thousands coming into and out of Fulton Ferry Landing each day. For more than fifty years, Fulton Ferry Landing remained the commercial and business center of the city of Brooklyn which gave this third of the parish a different character from Brooklyn Heights and Vinegar Hill which were much more residential. While Brooklyn Heights has always been well known to New Yorkers from other parts of the city and visitors from near and far, the smaller neighborhood of Vinegar Hill has its own rich but not as well know history.

By the time of Assumption's establishment in 1842 its northeastern part had already been christened as Vinegar Hill and was widely known by this moniker. Named for the 1798 battle of the same name by Irish nationalists against their English overlords which failed and soon led to the dissolution of the Irish parliament, the area immediately to the west of what would soon become the Brooklyn Navy Yard had been purchased by the Jackson and Sands families after the American Revolution from the Remsens and Rapelyes, two Dutch families who had owned it for generations. After eventually buying out most of the Sands' property, the Jacksons cleverly named the area after this now famous battle to attract the stream of Irish workers coming for job in the nearby navy yard to rent apartments for their families in the buildings they had recently built.

Father Dennis, C.O.**

On behalf of the Fathers and Brothers of our Brooklyn Oratory, I am pleased to announce that for the next academic year (2018-2019) Fr. Anthony Andreassi has been named the interim principal of Regis High School.

Fr Daniel Lahart, S.J., President of Regis, has asked Fr Anthony to take on this position as the school begins a search for a permanent replacement of the current principal who recently announced his retirement. After consultation with me as his Canonical Superior and his brothers in the community, Fr. Anthony has received our full support for this affirmation of his skills as an educator and leader.

Over the next few weeks, we will begin the process of re-aligning most of Fr Anthony's parish pastoral and administrative duties in anticipation of the new position which will begin in July.

Of course, he will continue his pastoral duties here as a regular presider and homilist in rotation of the weekend and weekday Masses. Our Oratory supports this honor for Fr Anthony- albeit for a limited time- as it aligns with the education of Catholic youth. This ministry has been a part of the Oratory charism since the time of St Philip Neri. As many of you know, Fathers Anthony and Mark have worked at Regis High School now for a number of years.

In addition, the Oratorians and the Jesuits have had a long, close history and friendship since the days when St. Philip and St Ignatius lived and worked in 16th century Rome.

These saints visited one another frequently and knew one another as close colleagues.

We ask your prayers for Fr Anthony as he assumes this new role that God who has begun the good work in him ( as in all of us who were baptized in Christ Jesus) bring it to grace filled fulfillment.
